EASY-TO-MAKE...



CARROT GIFT BOXES



You will need:

- Sheet of orange paper or card
- Green ribbon or yarn

Other things you'll need:

- Gluestick and scissors
- Black felt-tip
- Hole punch
- Compasses or something circular to draw around
- Small quantity of Easter sweets or small gifts

How to make it:

- Begin by taking the sheet of orange paper or card and drawing a circle. As a guide, the circle used for the gift boxes in the photo was approximately 17cm in diameter, but it doesn't matter what size is used. Cut out the circle.
- Fold the circle in half. Then cut along the fold to make two semi-circles. You only need one of these semi-circles to make a carrot, so one circle makes two carrot gift boxes. Put one of the semi-circles aside for now.
- 3 Now fold the semi-circle in half. Then fold in half again. Press the folds down neatly.
- Keeping the paper folded, cut a curve at the open edge of the folded paper as shown in the diagram.
- Use a pen to mark a point in the middle of the curved edge (marked in the diagram), then use a punch to cut a hole.
- Open out the semi-circle. Use a felt-tip to draw in some carrot-like details (see photo). Allow the ink to dry before continuing.
- Bring the two ends of the semi-circle together and glue them together to form a triangular cone.
- 8 Fill the carrot gift box with Easter sweets or small gifts.
- Thread green ribbon or yarn through the holes to bring the sides together and close the gift box. Tie the ribbon in a bow to secure.
